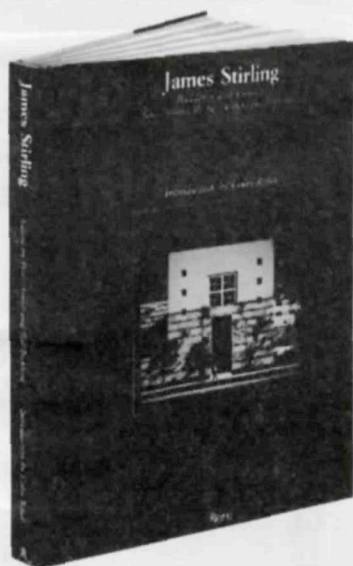

**JAMES STIRLING:
Buildings and Projects**

Edited by Peter Arnell and Ted Bickford. Essay by Colin Rowe.

This handsome monograph—the most complete ever published on Stirling—is yet another tribute to this internationally acclaimed architect, winner of the 1981 Pritzker Prize, the Arnold W. Brunner Memorial Prize and a recipient of a RIBA Gold Medal and an honorary fellowship in the AIA.

Tracing the development of Stirling's career from his education at Liverpool University to the present, this book documents all of his projects—built and unbuilt—with over 1000 photographs, plans and drawings. It highlights what John Jacobus called "one of the ten or twelve most crucial buildings in the history of modern architecture—the Engineering School at Leicester College," as well as museums in Cologne, Stuttgart, the Scientific Institute in Berlin, the Turner Gallery in London, and his buildings at Rice, Harvard and Columbia. 350 pages. 8½" x 11½".
