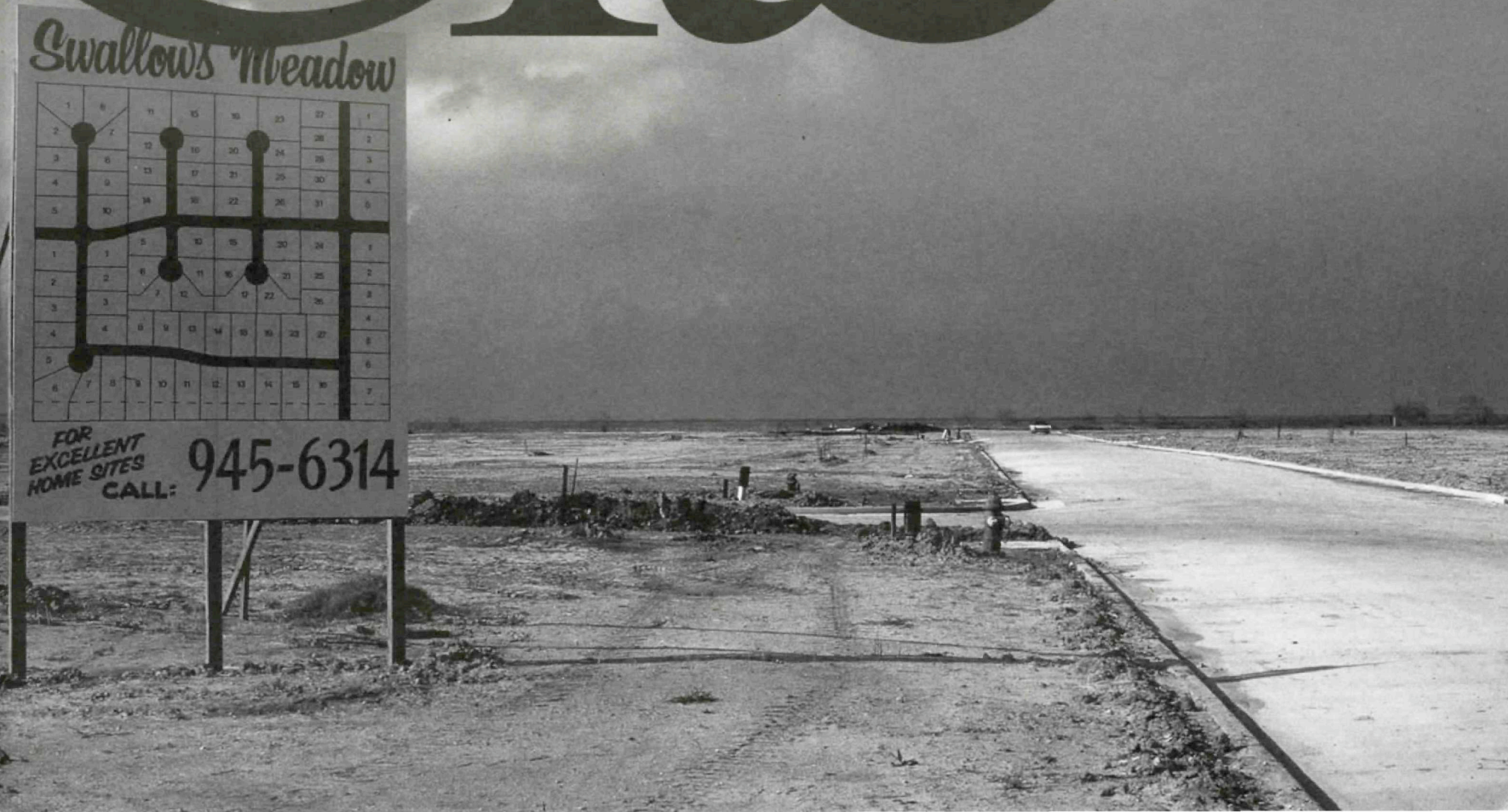

**Out of Cite:** *Cite* has been recognized with three awards for its Spring/Summer 1993 issue, *On the Border*. The issue, edited by Stephen Fox and Rafael Longoria, discusses the regional culture of the Texas-Mexico border region. The magazine includes a pull-out architecture tour booklet of the region between Harlingen and Laredo. The awards include the Texas Award for Historical Preservation by the Texas Historical Commission; the Presidio of La Bahia Award, third place, by the Sons of the Republic of Texas for *Cite's* outstanding contribution in the field of the Spanish Colonial period of Texas history; and the Bronze Medal by the Art Directors Club of Houston to *Cite's* graphic design firm, Minor Design Group, in the 38th annual competition of the Houston club.

**OverCite:** The Killam Hunting Lodge and the Lasater House were designed by Ford, Powell & Carson, for whom David Lake and Ted Flato worked at the time (*Cite*, Spring-Summer 1993). In addition, the stonework used on the Vallecillo Hunting Lodge was first used in this manner on the Tom Slick residence, designed by O'Neil Ford in 1956 and constructed using Vallecillo stone.
